 NORTH HALF

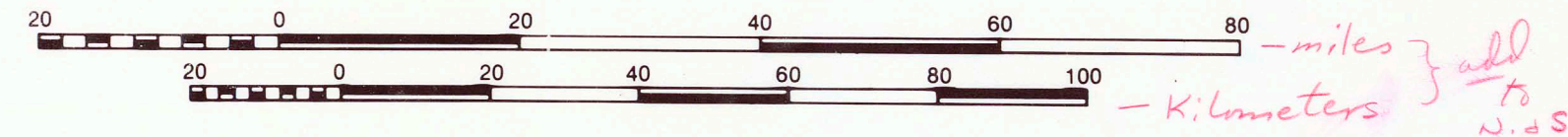
Green = Physiographic and climatic region boundaries

RULES
 Select seed within zone where planting or seeding is to be done. Use caution in introducing seed from outside. If local seed not available, select an alternative in the order shown:
 1. Adjacent zone within same physiographic and climatic subregion.
 2. Any zone within the same physiographic and climatic subregion.
 3. Zone within the same physiographic and climatic region or adjacent zone in another region.
 Use only seed within 500 feet elevation of planting or seeding location.
