# Trapping

- 2003: Mass trapping with sticky traps and Attract and Kill traps (Orland, Hamilton City, Willows and Artois)
- 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007: Attract and Kill traps placed in Orland area
- 2008: will again place Attract and Kill traps (now called Magnet OL traps) in Orland and Hamilton City area

# Survey and Assessment

- First one completed in mid 2005
- Updated as olive trees are added or removed
- 14 cents per tree, 10 trees minimum, 100 trees per acre maximum
- Second one completed in 2007

#### Outreach Program

- Informational letters sent to growers and homeowners:
  - Information on control techniques
  - Information on tree removal program
  - Information on EQIP program
- Provided sticky traps to growers
- Workshops held in 2006 and 2007
  - at local orchard for smaller growers; well attended
- Newspaper articles on public meetings



### Abatement

- What do you do if you are spraying but your neighbor is not?
  - Call the District at 865-1133 or 934-6501 to obtain an abatement request form (or pick up the form at the Glenn Co. Ag Office)
  - Fill it out and return to the Ag Office
  - Property is trapped by District
  - If OLFF is found, trees must be sprayed
    - By owner or district (who will charge)

# Roadside Spray Program

- 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008....?
- Every 4 to 6 weeks, depending on fly counts
- May thru Oct. or Nov.
- All roadside olive trees in Orland and Hamilton City area
