

Bowl-O-Rama wrap up by SB 4H 2018

This will be the 10th annual Bowl-O-Rama this year, usually held the first Saturday in January, after school has resumed.

-Reserve Bowling Alley – in the Fall, October/November. Peter was the main contact, Adriana was the supervisor in charge on Saturday

-Review County's previous year flier for details

-Create new flyer

-Email to County for approval and Club distribution. Lorin sent it out 2x to the club leaders – Late November & late December

2018- We reserved 17 lanes, and used a total of 13, 5 members per lane. Bowling alley requires a minimum of 4 per lane

Price: 4H members pay: \$12 per bowler, includes shoes, bowling, pizza and drink.

*Bowling alley charges \$14 per bowler, but agreed to collect \$2/bowler directly from the Club after all bowlers were registered, to help keep the individual cost down per bowler. Make sure that the Bowling Alley knows what 4H is going to charge the individual bowlers so they have their cash register set up with the correct amount. SB4H wrote the check (\$2 per bowler), and submitted for reimbursement from the county. The bowling alley only accepts corporate checks, not personal. Keep track of registered bowlers when they check in to double check the Bowling Alley #'s

Day of Event

- Call day prior to order 6 pizzas, so they can be ready and served at 12:30

12:30 – 1pm:

Registration, mingling and eating. Pizza/drinks continue to be filled throughout the event. 1 Pizza/1 pitcher per lane. Sign in Sheet – name, grade, club. Also have medical release forms in case parents are leaving.

Tell kids to talk and form teams of 4-5. We had 17 clipboards with team/lane sign ups. As soon as they formed a team, members would fill out on the clipboard form at the table. Designate team: Junior (7th grade and lower) or Senior (8th grade and up). Juniors get bumpers. (There may be someone younger than 8th

grade on your senior team as long as they do not use bumpers.) We had a designated committee member to help form teams if needed - Some come with friends and some come alone.

1pm -3pm

Bowling lanes are open. Practice for the first hour. Have an adult or two go to the lanes and help set up names, and make sure all of the teams are set up with bowlers. Make an announcement at 2pm that the "bowling for prizes" will begin. The Bowling Alley will then clear the scores of all lanes. When the round is over for each lane, report to the Bowling Alley and they can print up a score sheet. They can continue to bowl after the official score sheet is printed. Write score down on Team Sheet. At 2pm, we had parents go to each of the lanes to tell the bowlers the process, since it was hard to hear over the loud speaker. When winners are figured, gather members to announce. Committee members announced winners.

We had 10 Junior teams, 3 Senior teams
