PUBLIC SPEAKING IN 4-H

Public speaking skills are ranked number one among the desired skill sets of professionals.

Every 4-H member is encouraged to give a presentation each year. 4-H members practice by giving talks to project groups and at community club meetings, sharing information about the skills they learned in a project, and observing other people giving presentations.

4-H Presentations help youth develop life skills.

To prepare for a 4-H Presentation, youth learn to:

- Research a subject
- Organize ideas in a logical order
- Share knowledge with others
- Create and use graphics to support their presentation

When youth teach project skills in a presentation format, it demonstrates advanced skills and a deeper understanding of what was learned.

Placer County 4-H members have multiple opportunities to develop public speaking skills throughout the year. Members are encouraged to present at their club and project meetings. Presentation Day at the

to present at their club and project meetings. Presentation Day at the county, <u>area</u>, or <u>state</u> level are wonderful ways to give a variety of presentations and receive feedback. In countywide projects, we offer a yearly public speaking project led by experienced senior youth members and a Toastmaster Certified Coach.



SUMMER CAMP OPPORTUNITIES

4-H Placer County Residential Summer Camp is a county-based program that fosters healthy living in the



outdoors. Participating in camp programs help youth build self confidence, meet new people, and experience new opportunities. In Placer County, youth staff are selected through a panel interview process and then participate in an in-depth 6-month training. Adult leaders use the recommended curriculum *Counselor-In-Training: Encouraging Youth Development Outcomes at Camp*. All staff participate in the yearly summer camp survey program administered by the State 4-H Camping Advisory Committee to help improve the camp program for campers and youth staff. The cost of summer camp is \$180 and covers all activities, lodging, food, t-shirt, and camp photo.

4-H Mountain Horse Camp is held June 23 - June 29, 2019, at Stone Cellar in the Crystal Basin of the beautiful El Dorado National Forest **and it is open to ALL counties!** The camp dates were moved up to avoid conflict with State Fair for those that want to do both. Cost of Mountain Horse Camp is \$195. This covers lodging and participants' food. You must provide your own horse, tack, food, and transportation for your horse. Don't miss out on an exciting project with once-in-a-lifetime views, riding and friends.

Message from Placer County Fairgrounds



February 6, 2019

To Whom It May Concern,

The California State Veterinarian is recommending that all poultry exhibitions that include birds from high-risk counties (Los Angeles, Riverside, San Bernardino and Ventura) be cancelled due to an outbreak of the virulent Newcastle disease (VND). VND is a highly contagious respiratory virus in poultry that is nearly always fatal for poultry. Based off this recommendation as well as the JLA and FFA/4-H leaders, this part of the livestock exhibit for the 2019 Placer County Fair has been cancelled. This will include chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese and waterfowl.

We are looking into alternative activities for kids to participate in during the fair and will keep you informed as to when decisions are made.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause, however the care and safety of all animals is our main concern.
