Resource Conservation Districts:

- ▶ RCDs are non-regulatory, independent special districts
- ▶ There are 97 RCDs throughout California—each covers a different geographic territory
- ▶ RCDs are primarily funded through competitive grants but some RCDs also receive funding from local property taxes, fee for service work, and private donations.
- ▶ Rely on partnerships with landowners, tribes, conservation organizations, other RCDs, and local, state, and federal agencies

What RCDs Do:

- ▶ Provide assistance to communities to voluntarily conserve, protect, and restore wild and working landscapes
- ▶ Provide technical and educational assistance to property owners/managers
- ▶ Connect landowners to resources - we are NOT funders
