You and your family are invited to attend the 62nd **Annual Cattle Tour** to be held Thursday, August 25, 2011. This event is put on each year by Cooperative Extension, with the Siskiyou County Cattlemen's and CattleWomen's Associations plus the California Cattlemen's Association.

The Siskiyou County Cattlemen's and CattleWomen's Associations will furnish a barbecued beef lunch, beverages and tableware. **PLEASE BRING EITHER A SALAD OR DESSERT** sufficient for your group and maybe a little extra. It might be helpful for names from A to M to bring desserts and the others to bring salads so we get a good mix of both.

The tour is on Beef Quality Assurance. For those with a BQA certificate they need renewal. For those that have not yet gotten a certificate this is the closest, easiest opportunity. All beef producers are encouraged to attend, and may register to become certified in Beef Quality Assurance by taking a test at the end of the program. Attendance is free, certification costs are \$25. Interested non-producers may want to attend to learn what the industry is doing to continue to ensure a safe, wholesome product. Registration starts at 9:30 a.m. at the City Hall in Dorris with the program starting promptly at 10 a.m. Producers from Oregon may attend and become certified in Beef Quality Assurance through the Oregon Cattlemen's Beef Quality Assurance program.


