# PLANTING CALENDAR

#### AUGUST

Seeds: arugula, bok choy, broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, peas, carrots, radish, kale, collards, leeks, lettuce, spinach, chard

# NOVEMBER

Seeds: arugula, fava beans, spinach, chard, radish
Starts: bok choy, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, collards, kale, lettuce, peas, spinach, chard

As soon as the rain starts, plant CA native plants Transplants: onion and shallot

#### FEBRUARY

Seeds: peas, carrots, onions, radish, arugula, kale, parsley, cilantro in the garden beds. Potatoes and shallots can also be planted directly into the ground now. Start seeds indoors (if available) for warm-season cropstomatoes, peppers, eggplants, basil. Starts: Set out plant starts of lettuce, peas, chard, leeks, onions, and brassicas

#### MAY

Seeds: Beans, corn, cucumber, melon, and squash Starts: (If summer watering available) eggplants, tomatoes, peppers, melons

#### SEPTEMBER

Seeds: arugula, broccoli, peas, beans, bok choy, onion sets, carrots, radish, kale, leeks, lettuce, spinach.
Starts: broccoli, cabbage, collards, cauliflower, chard, celery

#### DECEMBER

A CALL

It's a good time to spread wildflower seeds, or other annual flower seeds-such as california poppy, cornflower, marigold, scabiosa, and calendula.

Seeds: Leafy greens in the beginning of the month, radishes, fava beans, chard.

Starts: onion and other allium family plants at the beginning of the month, collards, broccoli, bok choy, peas

## MARCH

Seeds: Direct sow: carrots, radishes, beets, parsnips, turnips, potatoes, cilantro.
Start Indoors (if available): squash, cucumber, peppers, eggplant
Starts: Set out starts of broccoli, greens, peas, herbs

#### OCTOBER

Seeds: arugala, leeks, lettuce, peas, radish, spinach, chard, fava beans.

Starts: bok choy, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, garlic (cloves) Perennials and native plants can be planted at the end of the month

#### JANUARY

Seeds: Indoors if available: arugula, fava beans, carrots, collards, kale, lettuce, onion sets, peas, radish, chard.

Starts: vegetable plants and seeds should not be planted this month, due to the danger of frost. The exception is bareroot perennials, such as fruit trees, strawberries, cane berries, blueberries, and grapes

### APRIL

Seeds: Beans, corn, cucumber, melon, and squash can be direct-seeded in the garden late this month.

Starts: set out tomato, pepper, and eggplant starts mid month
