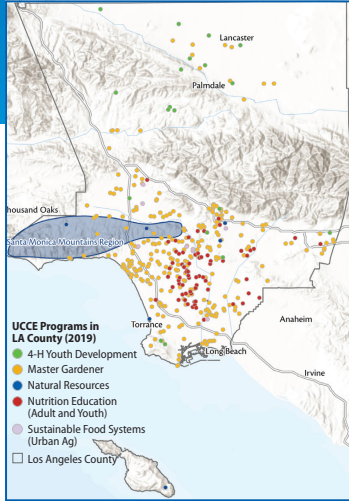

4-H Youth Development Program

4-H empowers youth to reach their full potential through hands-on learning, engagement in local communities, and development of leadership and life skills.



Nutrition, Family and Consumer Sciences

UC Cooperative Extension is dedicated to providing nutrition education to low-income Los Angeles County families. Staff reach out to them in community settings to help them eat healthy and shop smart.

UC Master Gardener Program

UC Cooperative Extension trains community-based Master Gardeners who volunteer their time to community and school gardens. They help Los Angeles County residents grow their own food and help build stronger communities.



Sustainable Food Systems

UC Cooperative Extension conducts research and provides technical assistance to help individuals and organizations achieve success in developing sustainable food systems projects in urban Los Angeles County.

Natural Resources
