

Mission 4-H Club High School Scholarship Award

The Mission 4-H Club has set up a scholarship Award as a combination of academic recognition and financial assistance for enrolled and graduating

4-H members. This scholarship is funded through fundraising by the Mission 4-H Club and is available for our clubs members. Scholarship money will allotted no later than June 30th, 2021. The money is to be used towards future education. The amount awarded is \$50 for each year they were in the club during High school. No more than \$200.00.

Administration

The Community Leaders of the Mission 4-H Club will administer this scholarship. Then, a committee of leaders & parents will review applications and make recommendations to the Community Leader and Club officers. Applications due dates and amounts will be announced at the beginning of the year. Again, in the Spring months of April and May.

Scholarship Award Program

Eligibility Requirements

A student who is a enrolled member of the Mission 4-H Club and has been in the club all years in High School. The student must be in good standing at school and in the Mission 4-H Club. Before you are eligible to receive the scholarship, you must submit your Record Book on time. The application may be hand written or typed.

Receiving Scholarship

The students awarded this scholarship must provide the name of the college or vocational school they plan on attending.

Due dates and receiving

The application is due on the announced date. It must be postmarked and sent to Missions 4-H Club, P.O. Box 308, Soledad, CA 93960. It the responsibility of the member to ensure it has arrived on time. If permitted, the Club leader will announce any alternative drops locations.
