4-H County Emerald Star What is an Emerald Star?

Fresno County offers 4-H’ers the opportunity to earn an Emerald Star. The Emerald Star program is designed for intermediate and senior 4-H members ages 13 and up. The Emerald Star project's purpose includes:



1. Providing an opportunity for 4-H members to develop projects in their community or in 4-H beyond the club level.
2. Improving, creating, and expanding 4-H programs.

Helping individual 4-H members grow and improve in the areas of organization, leadership, and project planning. This program is designed to help youth learn about project planning, organization, and presentation.

Typically, youth develop an action plan for some type of multi-county event. They then organize and facilitate this event. After completion and presentation of their project, they are awarded with the Emerald Star ranking. Those members wishing to apply for the “Homer Williams Scholarship” must have completed an Emerald Star Project. Project Meeting Tips & Ideas

During this time, it may be difficult to meet the 6-hour requirement to complete projects. Below are ideas/tips to assist in meeting the minimum.

- Zoom meetings testing knowledge or sharing Project activities completed at home (Pygmy Goat Project - Jeopardy game testing knowledge)
- Assign activities project members can complete at home and submit completed work back to Project Leader (Baking Project – baking cookies, photography – share photos, etc.)
- Poster of livestock breeds/knowledge (Rabbit Project - sharing varieties of Rabbit breeds)
- Sharing videos of project aspects (Horse project - confirmation of a horse)

Remember -

Annual Project Reports are required to participate in livestock projects at local Fairs.

The California 4-H Youth Summits are three-day leadership development conferences usually hosted in four locations across the state. *The summit will be held virtually until further notice due to the Coronavirus 2019 Pandemic.*

- Learn and practice personal leadership skills
- Learn about career pathways and college
- Build connections with 4-H members, volunteers, and staff throughout the area



Who should attend - Intermediate 4-H'ers (ages 11-13). Senior 4-H members, ages 14+, can sign up as facilitators (staff).

Mission - Youth Summit programs are designed to grow the leadership abilities of intermediate 4-H'ers (ages 11-13) and give hands-on leadership opportunities to senior 4-H'ers (ages 14+). Participants are mentored by senior 4-H'ers and caring adult volunteers. Younger members develop stronger relationships with their older peers as they both develop their leadership skills.

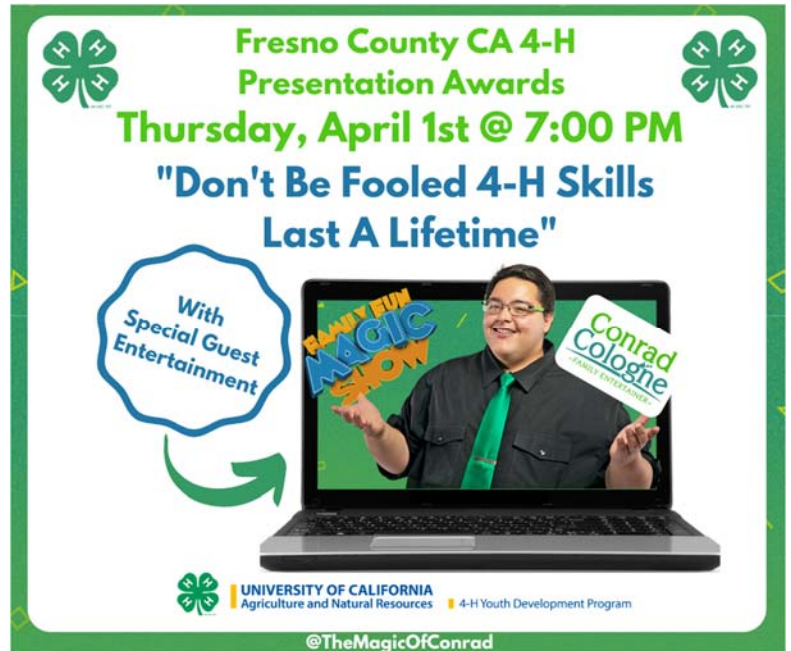
