Process Change for In-Person 4-H Events

We are pleased to announce that UC ANR 4-H has revised their participation and permission process for in-person participation at events. These changes will be effective immediately and will remain in place until further State of California guidance is provided.

As of April 2, 2021, the California Department of Public Health is now allowing Fairs to open. Essentially, fairs can open at limited capacity depending on their tier, unless their county health department says otherwise. The guidance for fairs falls under the same guidelines as "Amusement Parks" until fair specific guidance is released. For details, click here.

As such, Risk & Safety Services and the Statewide 4-H office are instituting the following practice for allowing 4-H participation in CDFA and other sponsored fairs or livestock shows:

- 1. The request for exception survey is no longer needed for fairs/auctions/shows.
- 2. The home county for where the fair/livestock show is taking place must verify that the fair has a COVID-19 safety plan and upload the COVID-19 safety plan or protocols for the fair via survey.
- 3. Once the protocols are received, your local 4-H program may plan to participate.
- 4. The relevant information about safety and COVID-19 prevention for the event must be shared with 4-H participants, families, and adult volunteers so they are aware of and will be expected to comply with the fair's safety protocols.
- 5. 4-H cannot participate in fairs that do not have COVID -19 safety protocols in place.

For ALL non-fair/show/auction in-person events like presentation day, achievement events and fundraisers, continue to use the Safety Protocols outline by your Placer & Nevada County Offices.

RAI BAHADURSINGH MEMORIAL 4-H SCHOLARSHIP

PLACER COUNTY 4-H \$1,000

Rai Bahadursingh M.D. along with his wife Ardyce were avid 4-H leaders in Sacramento County during the 1970s. They raised four children in the 4-H program, and strongly believed in the value of the 4-H motto "Learn by Doing." Their influence even extended to the next generation, as three grandchildren were active members of the Loomis Community 4-H Club. Rai volunteered as the 4-H Camp doctor several summers and thoroughly enjoyed his opportunity to work with youth. He passed away this past February at the age of 96, after living the American dream. He immigrated to the United States from the Caribbean Island of Trinidad to attend college and ultimately medical school. He was a lifelong learner, loved practicing medicine and always put his family first. He valued education, and with that in mind, his family has established the Rai Bahadursingh Memorial Scholarship.

Evaluators are an important part of making the competitions successful! As an evaluator, you help youth improve by giving them feedback based on a standard evaluation rubric and written constructive feedback.

4-H volunteer leaders, 4-H staff, 4-H members (older than 16 years of age and not giving a presentation), or someone else with experience in public speaking.

Responsibilities

- Complete the NEW Presentation Evaluator Course by May 7th, 2021 by 5 p.m.

- Attend an evaluator orientation. Choose one when you sign up:

- Become familiar with the 4-H Presentation Manual 2021.
- Evaluate 7-8 presentations during one time slot.
- Complete the digital evaluation form and provide written positive and constructive feedback to help each presenter improve.
