MEDITERRANEAN DESIGN PRINCIPLES

- Use of Natural Products honors the legacy of Master Stonemasons from Ages Past
- Round / curved shrubs trimmed in mounds around a Gravel / Stone Path create a sense of Peace and Order.
- Spaces designed for socializing and spending time enjoying company and nature.



PROPORTIONS

Use of Proportional Ratios for Structures and Layouts.

Recommended Ratio of Length to Width of 1: 1.6



GARDEN STEPS

- Ratio of height of riser x2 and width of Tread=26
- 5 inch riser x2 = 10
- 16inch Wide Tread



CREATING JOURNEYS

- Terraces
- Pathways
- Corridors



CREATING DESTINATIONS

- Create Scenes
- Statues create a moment of interest to pause and reflect along the Journey
- Shady seating scenes create a memorable place to pause and enjoy each other's company.



MANAGING TERRAIN

- Terracing and curved pathways and steps allow us to manage slopes.
- Switchback Pathways allow access to steep areas
- Planting in between rocks of walls allows for softening and interest


DROUGHT TOLERANT PLANTS

- Start with tallest plants and progress to smallest plants
- May be Monochromatic or Multi-colored depending on the atmosphere you wish to create



EXOTIC ACCENTS

- Succulent Type Plants add to otherwise mundane by adding different textures and Heights to beds.
- Creeping plants cascading over rock walls draw the eye to notice the height and texture of the walls.




CREATING SHADE AREAS






