Categories include:

Category 1 - Dairy Foods - One of the principle ingredients must be a dairy product such as butter, milk, cheese, sour cream, yogurt, etc. No substitutes. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers/ cheese balls, cookies, cakes, desserts, breads.

Category 2 - Traditional - Must include information about the original tradition of the recipe and how it relates to your family. Acceptable entries include: breads, cookies, cakes, desserts.

Category 3 - Candies - Caramels/taffies, chew candies, creams, fudges, divinity dipped candies, fruit and nut candies or brittles, candied apples, stuffed dates, hard candies, lollipops, lemon drops, gum drops, popcorn balls, etc.

Category 4 - Healthier Goodies - Main ingredient(s) must be nutritious i.e., whole wheat grains, bran, nuts, fruit, vegetables. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers, snacks, green leafy salads and fruit salads.

Category 5 - Trix-From-a-Mix - Begin with a mix, then add additional items, not just what is listed in mix instructions. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers & snacks (no meat items), cookies, breads, desserts, cakes.

Category 6 - Holiday Decorations - Must be designed and assembled by the 4-H'er. Entries may include: Centerpieces, place settings (include menu, but no food) suggest taking photo before for quick assembly, Gift Basket (filled and decorated), Creative Holiday Craft (hand crafted holiday decorations, ornaments, jewelry, etc.)

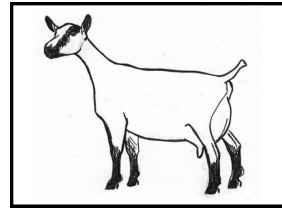
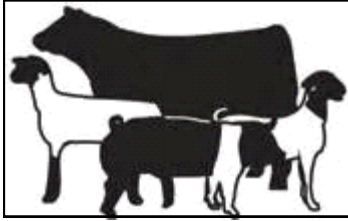
Category 7 - New For 2022- Delectable Disguised Foods - Acceptable entries include: Create a food that doesn't look like the original food. Spaghetti Cake, Cookies that look like French Fries, Chocolate Cheese Board, Kitchen Sponge Cake. (*This category changes every year.*)

4-H encourages every member to develop and polish their public speaking skills by participating in County Presentation Day. There are many ways to participate in Presentation Day. Participants may give a traditional demonstration or illustrated talk where they show "how-to-do" something using visual aids or posters or a prepared speech or interpretive reading or an impromptu speech etc. The ways to participate are explained in the *CA 4-H Presentation Day Manual*. Take time to read about the various ways to participate in Presentation Day, and then research your topic. Find an interpretive reading you enjoy or a favorite recipe you can use to develop into a presentation. Prepare your script, make your posters, or gather your props, if your category requires such items. Spend time practicing your presentation. Calling all "Runners", friends of runners, family of runners and 4-H members. Fresno County 4-H announces the return of Color Me Green 5K Fun Run/Walk

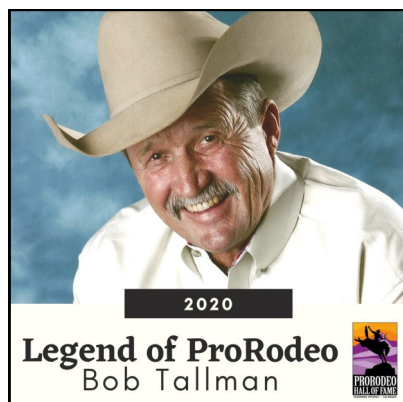
