## March 2022 Edition COVID-19 Safety Protocols

Below are the current safety guidelines for Butte County 4-H as required by California 4-H.

- Indoor and outdoor meetings under 75 individuals are permitted.
- Masks are required for indoor events.
- Masks are optional at outdoor events, but social distancing is still required.
- These policies apply to all individuals regardless of age or vaccination status.
- Guidelines can be more strict as deemed necessary by local public health agencies, but cannot be less strict than directed by California 4-H.

We do not yet know if the State of California lifting mask mandates in public schools will result in a change in 4-H Policy. If it does, membership will be updated as soon as possible.

Pink Eye in Cattle

Dr. Gabriele Maier, DVM, Cooperative Extension Specialist in Veterinary Medicine, UC Davis and Dr. Katherine Watson, Pathologist at UC Davis will discuss submitting samples to the California Animal Health and Food Safety (CAHFS) Lab to find answers to why did it die. They will

also share unique cases the CAHFS Lab have helped cattle producers identify to improve herd health and management.
