Do you have a favorite food? How about sharing it with others at the annual **4-H Favorite Foods Day**? The event includes planning a menu with your favorite food as a item, selecting a theme with a table setting for one, preparing your favorite food at home and bringing it to the event. You will be judged on your appearance (appropriate dress, knowledge, and confidence), the menu's color, texture and nutritional value; the appropriateness of your table setting and arrangement; and the quality of your favorite food (texture, flavor, and eye appeal). Your table setting must include all of the tableware (dishes, utensils, flatware) for serving all of the foods listed on your menu card for one person.

There will be awards for junior, intermediate, and senior divisions. In addition, special cash awards will be given to the best beef, lamb, pork, poultry, olives, rice, prune and almond or walnut dishes. All table settings will be judged and receive special recognition. Primary members (K-3rd grade) will receive a special participation ribbon.

Adults are encouraged to participate, by entering a "Healthy Choice Dish".

The adult division does not require a table setting or a menu. Must include the recipe

All entries are due **Friday , December 9th, 2022** online or to the 4-H Office., by 5PM

A completed entry includes the entry form and a written recipe for your favorite food.

Late entries will not be judged.

Upon receipt of your entry form, a packet of more information will be mailed to you to help you plan your entry and help you keep your favorite food safe while preparing and transporting.

Non-participating 4-Hers are invited to attend to view fellow 4-Hers' entries. During judging, non-participants will not be allowed in the area but alternative educational activities are being planned. You may also participate in the Life Skills Judging contest (see article below).

There will be no tasting of participants' dishes at the end of the event due to food safety issues and the length of time the food is on display without proper refrigeration or heating.

Manton Club Report ...by Colton Ramos

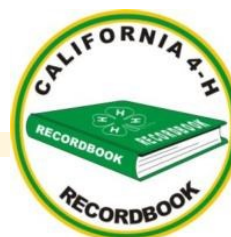

Peanut Clusters

From the Lassen Colony Food Project



Here is an easy recipe to make, a no-bake sweet homemade treat. Creamy white chocolate and peanut butter are always a winning combination. We made this recipe without using the oven—"SO TASTY"!

- 1 (12 oz) package white chocolate chips
- 22-3 tablespoons peanut butter
- 1 1/4 cups crispy toasted rice cereal
- 1 cup Spanish peanuts
- 1 cup miniature marshmallows
- Line baking sheets with wax paper.








In a large saucepan over low heat, melt white chocolate with peanut butter, stirring constantly. Let mixture cool slightly, then stir in cereal and peanuts, Fold in marshmallows.

Drop mixture by tablespoonfuls onto prepared baking sheets, Let cool until firm.
