The cooking academy enrichment program is open to all elementary schools in Placer County.


We are currently in search of a highly motivated teen who can assist with the program at Newcastle Elementary for the upcoming year starting in January. Training will be required.

4-H SUMMER CAMP IS BACK !!!

Placer County 4-H Camp Youth and Adult Volunteers Needed

Placer County 4-H Camp is on the calendar for the last week of July, 24th-29th 4-H Camp is a fun opportunity for members to engage in a variety of activities. Members are combined in groups of similar ages under the supervision of their youth and adult counselors. In these groups, campers learn to make decisions, share responsibilities, solve problems, and organize housekeeping tasks and their daily schedule. Youth are also offered a wide variety of activities depending on the camp facility. These could include hiking, swimming, fishing, archery, shooting sports, climbing wall, arts and crafts, nature, astronomy, etc. Campers also work on creating original skits and musical programs for their campfires

We are still in search of more 4-H Camp Leadership to allow for the event to happen. We are currently in need of more camp chaperones and youth directors. Adult chaperones must be at least 25 years of age and youth must be at least 15 years of age.

Youth counselors are 4-H youth leaders who have been selected to participate in the camp program. Their responsibilities include planning camp, teaching activities, organizing and hosting events during camp, serving as camp program staff and as a cabin counselor for a group of campers. Junior counselors are mentors, teachers and role models. They work in teams to help with logistics, activity planning, evening programs, traditions, enrichment activities, and group challenges.

Adult counselors are 4-H cleared adults who have been selected to attend camp and will be assigned a cabin group to live with during the week. The adult volunteer serves as a resource and support for the Junior Counselors in their cabin. Some adult volunteers will serve as team advisors and work with Junior Counselors prior to camp to help plan activities.

Youth Directors must be at least 17 years old. Youth directors are responsible for leading the team of youth counselors, planning and conducting the training retreat, and serve as support for their junior counselors. They provide a second line of discipline for campers. Two are selected for the camp year.

Advisor at the 2022 Regional 4-H Champions Network meeting in Madison, WI

Our new 4-H Youth Development Advisor, Dr. Matthew Rodriguez attended the 4-H Champions Network meeting in Madison Wisconsin to discuss innovative ways to implement the 4-H Thriving Model of positive youth development at the national, state, and county levels. Matt was excited to learn about the 4-H Thriving Model and the theories of its framework. Key to the to the model is the concept of a youth's "spark," which is defined as a "passion for a selfidentified interest or skill. The model illustrates the process of positive youth development in 4-H programs by connecting high quality program settings to the promotion of youth thriving.

Policy Reminders

Fundraisers

The **Fundraiser Form 8.7** needs to be submitted one month prior to the proposed fundraising event. Please attach additional pages as needed. You need to work with the 4-H YDP staff for any fundraiser that requires a Facility Use Agreement and Certificate of Insurance for the facility hosting the event.

Incidents

Should an incident arise at a meeting, an **Incident Form** should be completed. Use this form to document vehicle accidents, theft, property damage or loss. This form should also be used to report injuries to ANR volunteers, 4-H members, program participants, or visitors. This form should be completed within 48 hours of the incident.

Facility Use Requests

Facility Use Requests (FUR) Forms must be completed prior to the beginning of a project, meeting, or event. Please allow 10-14 days to process requests. New facilities may take longer. You may complete the FUR forms for events and monthly meetings at:


