






# Waste Tires

## HOW TO RECORD AND DISPOSE OF WASTE TIRES ON YOUR SITE



## General Storage Guidelines

-  Store separate from other waste to prevent cross-contamination.
-  Stacking/piling tires in an organized manner to prevent fire hazards, facilitate inspection, and allow easy access for removal.
-  Store under roofing or in covered containers to prevent water accumulation (creates optimal mosquito breeding conditions & tire degradation).



## Indoor/Outdoor Storage Guidelines

**Indoor:** Waste tires stored adjacent to walls shall not extend more than 25 feet nor exceed 50 feet in width. Avoid storing tires in exits, stairway or ramp enclosures, boiler rooms, mechanical rooms, or electrical equipment rooms.

**Outdoor:** Piles not exceeding 5,000 square feet or 50 feet in width. Pile volumes must not exceed 50,000 cubic feet or 6 feet in height within 20 feet of property lines, buildings, or fencing; otherwise, the height limit is 10 feet. Tire storage piles must be at least 10 feet away from lot lines or buildings.

## Waste Tire Program: Hauler/Facilities Search

A registered hauler is required to transport waste tires. [Click here](#) to search for registered haulers and/or permitted waste tire facilities.

A registered hauler will provide a completed [Waste Tire Hauler Manifest](#) for you to sign. Keep a copy of this **for 3 years**.



## One-Time Pickup or Register for TPID

Contact Tire Management Program: (866) 896-0600, or [wastetires@calrecycle.ca.gov](mailto:wastetires@calrecycle.ca.gov). Request a **one-time pickup** and they will provide you with a 7-digit #. If you generate waste tires on a semi-frequent basis, request a permanent TPID # instead (*a REC may check with Risk & Safety Services if they need to confirm their TPID*). A registered hauler will request your one-time pickup # or your permanent TPID # upon tire pickup.



## Earth911 Recycling Search

As another option, visit [Earth911](#) for an extensive recycling database. Type in your zip code to find a recycler in your area. If transporting to a recycling facility, you still must use a registered hauler for transportation.
