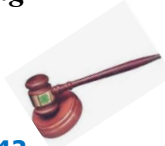

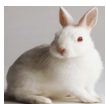

COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORTING



4-H Members Making a Difference in our Community! It happens all the time, however many of your IMPORTANT efforts are NOT being reported in the online survey system. Why is this necessary and crucial to us?

- ✓ Shows County Board of Supervisors how 4-H benefits the community
- ✓ Helps secure financial support of County Budget
- ✓ Used at State 4-H Office for accumulative service hour reporting on a national level
- ✓ Gives County Director of Cooperative Extension (UCCE) data for reporting.
- ✓ Offers youth Community Service Officers a leadership skill in completing reports
- ✓ When shared, it gives clubs and others new ideas of community service activities
- ✓ Gives a sense of pride to all 4-H members seeing how their work makes a difference

With the transition to the new IWP website platform we have added a link to the left side for easy access. Reports may be completed by Leaders, Club Officers, parents or members if they know the following:

- ✓ Month and year of completion
- ✓ What you did
- ✓ Where it was done
- ✓ Total number of youth and adults that participated
- ✓ Total amount of time each person spent
- ✓ Provide a contact email address

If one or more people spent a significantly greater amount of time it may be reported separately as planned or organized the activity for a more accurate report. For example, 6 members spent 1 hour each collecting and delivering items. However, 2 members acted as committee chairs and spent 3 hours each planning, communicating, and carrying out the activity then it can be reported as two separate surveys. - Each student must keep accurate records available for GSFC to review
- Funds must be repaid at the end of the project or when the animal is sold
- Funds are available for one project per year, per student
